

**LAVENIA (OR LAVINA) CHAPEL CEMETERY
(LOWER DUCK CREEK)
BROADWATER COUNTY
NEAR TOWNSEND, MONTANA
NOVEMBER 2006**

This cemetery is located north of Townsend, Broadwater County, Montana, Township 8 North, Range 2 East, Section 17. It is three miles west of Secondary Highway 284 on the Lower Duck Creek Road. The signs denote "Lavina Cemetery." The Fairview Cemetery is next to this cemetery. Two brothers owned the land of the Fairview and Lavenia Cemeteries.

"Duck Creek cemetery was plotted and a church was built by Frank Keene on a hill which was part of his farm. The church and cemetery was named Lavenia Chapel after his daughter Lavenia who died in 1893 at five months of age. Thomas J. Keene, son of Flave Keene died February 19, 1887 and was buried in this cemetery. The Lavenia Chapel cemetery was used by members of the Frank Keene family and others including the Frank Campbells, E. A. Campbells, the Anslome Parkers, the A. H. West family and the DeBordes. A sandstone monument is on Marie West's 1896 grave, great grandmother of Maudie Chamberlain. There is one other sandstone monument on an infant son of McClintock, 1894. These sandstone markers are made from the same sandstone used as the foundation stones of the Lavenia Chapel. The sandstones of the church's foundation are still where they were placed."
