

**ST. JOSEPH'S CEMETERY
(CANTON CEMETERY)
BROADWATER COUNTY
TOWNSEND, MONTANA
SEPTEMBER 2008**

This cemetery is located in Broadwater County, Lat: 46°24.404'N Lon: 111°26.670'W, elevation 4040, Township 8 North, Range 2 East, Section 35, SW corner of N 1/2 of NE 1/4, deeded to the Roman Catholic Bishop of Helena, John Baptist Brondel, on March 22, 1899. As you leave Townsend going west on Highway 12, turn left on secondary road 284 for approximately seven miles. The cemetery is located behind the church on the hill. The church was built in 1875-76. In 1954 St. Joseph's Church was removed from its original setting in the valley at Canton and placed on ground connecting it to St. Joseph's cemetery.

“Canton was an old town in original Meagher County. The rich farm land around here supported some of the area's oldest settlements. The post office, established in 1872 with William Tierney as postmaster, was discontinued in 1935. When the Canyon Ferry Dam was built and the lake filled, all Canton Valley went under water.” Roberta Carkeek Cheney, *Names on the Face of Montana, The Story of Montana's Place Names*, Mountain Press Publishing Company, Missoula, 1983.

Missouri Valley Mission Became Parish in 1900 (The Register, August 3, 1941, Section 3, Page 11)

“Townsend. – (Holy Cross Parish) – On July 16, 1900, the Missouri valley mission became a parish, and the Rev. Francis O’Farrell was appointed its first pastor, with residence in Townsend. In his able pastorate of six years, he built Holy Cross church at Townsend and improved St. Joseph’s church at Canton by the addition of the tower. Father Arts succeeded Father O’Farrell in October, 1906. He resigned in August, 1916, after ten years of faithful service. Since September of that year the present incumbent, the Rev. S. J. Sullivan, has been in charge.

“But long before the appointment of a resident priest to Townsend, the district was attended by missionary priest. The first recorded visit of a priest to the White inhabitants of this valley was made by Father Kuppens in the fall of 1865. It was a hurried trip from St. Peter’s mission to Diamond City. In the spring of 1865, Father Kuppens spent some time in Helena, where he discussed the selection of a site for a church in that city. He then started on his missionary rounds and in the fall of the same year, 1865, he went back to Sun River, but scarcely had he returned to St. Peter’s mission when he received an urgent summons from Diamond City. He made the journey on horseback in a day and a half, arriving in time to administer the Last Sacraments to a dying girl, the daughter of Michael Sullivan. He remained in Diamond City until Sunday to give the miners an opportunity of hearing Mass. The same day he started on his homeward journey, stopping that night in the home of Henry Whaley at Cave Gulch. He said Mass there the next morning.

In October, 1866, Helena welcomed its first resident priests, Father Kuppens and D’Aste, with Father Kuppens as pastor. On Nov. 1 of that year they dedicated the Church of the Sacred Hearts, the fifth Catholic Church for Whites in Montana. From that time until July, 1900, Missouri valley and adjacent country were attended from Helena. Father Kuppens resided in Helena until the spring of 1868, and there continued his

strenuous work for God and humanity. Thus, in December, 1866, a few weeks after his appointment to Helena, he was summoned to Cave Gulch, where miners were in armed conflict over mining claims. It was a desperate affray and several miners were killed. Father Kuppens hurried on horseback to the scene, swam the Missouri, and arrived while the firing was still in progress. His feats of horsemanship recall youthful visions of Israel Putnam and Paul Revere. It is recorded that, once in response to a call from General Meagher, he rode from St. Ignatius to Helena, nearly 200 miles, in less than 24 hours.

Priests' Names Household Words

From the spring of 1868 to the fall of 1873, Father VanGorp was pastor of Helena. After the appointment of Father D'Aste to Virginia City in the summer of 1868, Father C. Imoda came to Helena to assist Father VanGorp. He also visited from time to time the Blackfeet Indians, of whom he has been called the apostle. Father Imoda remained in Helena until November, 1874. In their residence in Helena, Fathers VanGorp and Imoda frequently visited this community and ministered throughout the entire vast Helena district with such devotion that their names became household words in the settlers' homes and in the miners' cabins. Father VanGorp was succeeded by Father L. B. Palladino, in whose pastorate the Canton church was built and dedicated. This Church of St. Joseph was built in the years 1875 and 1876, under the direction of Father Menetrey, who had succeeded Father Imoda as assistant pastor in Helena in November, 1873. Father Menetrey dedicated the church Sunday, Oct. 22, 1876.

For more than a decade, religious services were held in this valley before a church was dedicated. But this delay in building was not peculiar to this locality. Indeed, Canton was the first new place in which a church was built and dedicated within a period of ten years. The reason for this cessation in church building was owed to various causes. The larger places were provided with churches and from these larger places priests attended the outlying districts; the priests were few, the farming population was sparse, the permanence of the mining camps was uncertain. The places without churches were not neglected but were visited, more or less frequently, according to the number of Catholics and their distance from headquarters.

Dedicated in 1876, St. Joseph's church, Canton, is one of the oldest in the state. When Father Menetrey solemnly opened this sacred edifice, there were in the whole territory of Montana only six Catholic churches with resident priests, and one without a resident priest at Frenchtown. At two other places churches for Whites had been erected, one at Hell's Gate, built in the summer of 1863, the other near Silver City, built in the winter of 1864-1865. Both had been taken down. The logs that had formed the little church at Hell's Gate were brought to Missoula and put in place again. Thus was preserved this interesting relic of the past – the first church built for Whites in what is now Montana.”

McKnight, who came to the territory Nov. 11, 1863, and was an active business man from the time he first set foot in the west, died at his home in Townsend the 11 th inst., of pneumonia. He was 66 years old, and his death was a great shock to the people of the community in which he lived. McKnight was a native of the county Clare, Ireland, but he came to the United States about the year 1850. He first settled in Virginia City, in Montana. He leaves six children, one of whom, the oldest, William, is the present sheriff of Meagher county. It was but two weeks before his death that his youngest daughter, Francis, was wedded to Thomas McCormick, of Townsend. The funeral took place from his residence in the valley Wednesday at noon. It was the largest ever witnessed in the county. More than 100 conveyances were in the solemn procession to the Catholic church at Canton, where the sermon was preached by Rev. Father Dykman, of Helena.
