## Montana Summary

As of April 21, 2020, at 10:30 AM a total of 437 individuals have tested positive in Montana. Two additional deaths reported in Montana. Another person from Toole County (Shelby with five deaths), an assisted living resident in her 80's, and a man aged 65+ in Cascade County (Great Falls with two death), with underlying health conditions. Four (4) news cases reported since yesterday.

If you receive federal benefits – including Social Security retirement, survivor or disability benefits (SSDI), Railroad Retirement benefits, Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or Veterans Administration benefits – *and* you have a child *and* you weren't required file a tax return in 2018 or 2019, you should visit the <u>Non-Filers: Enter Payment Info Here tool</u> on IRS.gov *by Wed., April 22 at 10:00 a.m. Montana time.* 

- By entering information on this IRS website about your qualifying children, you can receive the \$500 per dependent child payment automatically in addition to your \$1,200 individual payment.
- If you do not enter this information by the *Wednesday, April 22* deadline, your payment at this time will be \$1,200 and, by law, the additional \$500 per eligible child amount would be paid in association with a return filing for tax year 2020.
