State Grants - Families, Small Businesses, Non-Profits, Health Service Centers and Individuals

Beginning May 7, several grants will be available to families, small businesses, non-profits, health service centers and individuals impacted by COVID-19. These grant programs were developed out of the federal CARES Act and were formed from public comment and the Coronavirus Relief Fund Advisory Council. The application is live at: covidrelief.mt.gov.

Wildland Firefighting COVID Protocols

To plan for fire activity during COVID-19, the National Multi-Agency Coordinating Group requested three regional Area Command Teams work with partners at all levels in the fire community to develop protocols for wildfire response during the COVID-19 pandemic. Gyms and Fitness Centers, Movie Theaters and Museums May Reopen

On May 7, Governor announced additional Phase One guidelines that will allow gyms and fitness studios, movie theaters and museums the option to reopen beginning Friday, May 15 at 50 percent capacity as long as they adhere to strict guidelines limiting capacity, requiring social distancing, and imposing thorough sanitation requirements. Hand sanitizer must be available, employees should wear masks and guests should wear masks when possible. Additionally, a six-foot distance must be maintained between equipment and in locker rooms.
