BCDC started in 1980 and has been involved in many, many community projects, resulting in millions of dollars invested to benefit the businesses and the people of Broadwater County. Some projects include:

- ◆ The Storefront Grant Program, which is ongoing for our treasured businesses. Millions of dollars have been spent between BCDC and business owners to improve signage and beautification
- ◆ Assisting with new sidewalks, ADA handrails for businesses and decorative street lights on Broadway Street
- ◆ Purchase and maintain downtown banners, banner brackets and flag pole brackets on Broadway
- ◆ Assisting with the beautification of Front Street
- ◆ Improving Broadway Street with flower planters and decorative brick bases around the trees
- ◆ Assisted with the watering program for community flowers and trees
- ◆ Developed WIFI park north of the Copy Cup
- ◆ Saved our Silos by the purchasing of the Silos property to protect the Silos and preserved open space in the midst of subdivision and housing (very large and ambitious project)
- ◆ Trail improvements including the trail from the Missouri River bridge towards the Silos and on Front Street

- ◆ Assist with Canyon Ferry Lake area improvements, promote general tourism in Broadwater County
- ◆ Developed the BCDC website, www.townsendmt.com, the most accessed website in Broadwater County, and is used by many potential tourists, entrepreneurs, and community members
- ◆ Installing and maintaining the webcam on Broadway and streaming it on www.townsendmt.com
- ◆ Working diligently to bring better, faster internet service to Broadwater County
- ◆ Enhanced the recycling in Townsend by purchasing a cardboard baler, trailers, and bins through a grant, and saved county citizens thousands of dollars
- ◆ BCDC has helped with many school needs and donated a new smart board for use by the school and community at the Library Community room
- ◆ And many, many other community projects and assistance over the years.

This year has been especially challenging with the passing of our beloved President, Ernie Forrey. Ernie was our organizer and was dedicated to our community. He is missed by everyone and will be for a long time. He was the heart and soul of BCDC.

Craig Vietz and I, John Hahn, have been acting as co-chairman. Other board members are: Bob Saxby, Tina Homann, Brian Obert, Laura Obert, Vic Sample, Allison Kosto, Nichole Brown, and Adam Six.

Our current focus with BCDC is to piece everything together after Ernie's passing and move forward with our ideas and community projects.

One important project is to revisit and update our last Community Assessment and Visioning which has engaged the community, resulting in many infrastructure improvements, business support, and community development projects. We are planning another visioning soon. Please watch for updates, as your involvement is invaluable for determining and prioritizing projects.

We will continue working with the Montana Dept. of Transportation (MDT) and others to finish the path to the Silos and work to get a pedestrian bridge alongside the main bridge north of Townsend.

We would like to coordinate with the any of the various organizations in Broadwater County to most efficiently utilize our local volunteers, time, and funds for our community. This newsletter is part of that focus and communication effort.

Broadwater Food Pantry

The Broadwater Food Pantry is an all-volunteer organization which provides supplemental food assistance to residents of Broadwater County. The volunteers are from the local churches and community. The Food Pantry relies on local donations for food and operating funds. It is able to operate without regulation by State and Federal Food Bank Networks.

Local support comes from many businesses including Bob's Supermarket, Town Pump, Townsend Rotary Club, Hunters Against Hunger, and individuals as well as other community and church donations.

Monetary donations can be brought to the Food Pantry or mailed. Donation receipts for tax reporting purposes are available. Bob's Supermarket has donation boxes at the checkout counters. For donations of meat or other perishable items please contact the board members listed or bring during the Friday hours. We can accept meat donations that are commercially processed.

You can find us at the Townsend Rotary Fall Fest. We are also involved in Trick or Treat So Others May Eat and the Ghost Stroll.

The Food Pantry strives to provide food for three meals a day for three days in a two-week period for families who have signed up to receive services. Anywhere from 50 to 250 people have been served monthly. If you are in need or know of someone in need come to the Food Pantry and sign-up.

We are thankful for Town Pump matching dollar for dollar up to \$7,500 from Sept. 1 through Nov. 30. We are also blessed to receive the Townsend Rotary Club match dollar for dollar up to \$1,000 from Mother's Day until Father's Day. We have also received grants from Rotary and Broadwater Community Foundation.

Most recent news! The Food Pantry has gotten a facelift inside and out! Thanks to the generosity of the Amish community, Townsend Rotary Club, Townsend Flooring, as well as many others, the Food Pantry has been resided, painted inside, new flooring, and a new cooler! We are truly blessed to live in such a giving community.

Broadwater Community Theater Revving up to Produce Summer Plays

Broadwater Community Theater is revving up for an exciting summer season of plays. After a rude shutdown of summer theater activity during COVID, theater committee members have been fortunate enough to interest Gabby Bakkum in directing a set of plays at The Lodge this summer. (See related story.)

The BCT committee, headed by LaRinda Spencer, has welcomed several new members including Angela Johnson, Jim Domino who is representing STOKE, an afterschool program for middle schoolers; Lenna Parr and Carla Amundson. Both Johnson and Parr have experience in professional dance and theater. Amundson just retired as Townsend Elementary School music teacher.

BCT is underwritten by the Fun For Life program a nonprofit organization in Broadwater County since 1996. The program gives scholarships to elementary school students in Townsend for music lessons, to attend theater workshops, art schools and foreign language internships.

During COVID 19, the Fun For Life Program was able to apply to the US Small Business Administration Economic Injury Advance for a grant. The program was awarded \$1,000 in March 2020.

In other news, the Fun For Life program is partnering with Townsend Rotary to fundraise for purchase of a sound system with individual remote microphones. Cost of the P.A. System is about \$13,000. Fun For Life has pledged \$1,000 toward the purchase. The community P.A. system will be available to community organizations as well as Rotary and community theater.

We also give at least one \$ 500 scholarship to a graduating senior, this year we gave two.

Vision Clinic

The Townsend Seventh-day Adventist church will once again sponsor a vision clinic this fall on Friday, Oct. 1 The vision clinic consists of a free eye exam by a board certified ophthalmologist and glasses will be provided free of charge as well. The Townsend Seventh-day Adventist church has sponsored two previous vision clinics in Townsend (2018 and 2019). Between the two clinics, over two hundred people received a free eye exam and glasses. Deep Creek Cemetery Association

The Deep Cemetery Association is a perpetual care cemetery and we are the largest cemetery in Broadwater County. The oldest resident was buried in 1871 and we have been expanding ever since with seven acres of grave sites and room to grow.

We have two part time caretakers, Bill Alley and Craig Vietz, who take great pride in what they do and interest in every visitor's question. We strive to keep the cemetery well-kept and green for all who visit. We have been working towards an accurate digital file of every gravesite and resident and hope to have that up and running soon along with having it linked to the museum's website so that family's from afar can research their families' interment. There is also a physical copy of the directory on site.

Just like any non-profit, we are always looking for funds to operate on. We keep our funds in CD's, bonds and money market accounts. With the past several years of low interest rates, our funds have dropped considerably with a very big blow occurring this year. One of our largest bonds was \$43000 invested in an oil company bond. The company went bankrupt and we ended up with \$826 from that bond. What a blow to our treasury account! Most of our operating funds come from what little interest we get from our investments, the sale of grave plots and some donations. We try to keep our equipment updated and our caretakers paid so hopefully we can continue with this service for a while longer.

STOKE

(Science, Technology, Outdoors, Knowledge, and Entrepreneurship)

STOKE is a unique non-profit founded by a few rebellious souls, with a noble purpose and lofty Big Sky objective: to provide opportunities that will inspire and nurture the human spirit, one kid at a time. STOKE was designed for kids by kids and adults wanting a change on the inside as well as a desire to achieve practical life skills through their passion for the outdoors and our community.

STOKE Overview

- Over the course of one year, STOKE expects to grow into one of the leading local supplemental providers of youth vocational and educational services in Townsend and Broadwater County.
- Currently, no similar type organization exists, nor has one been in place in our proposed initial service area (Townsend and Broadwater County). Yet, there are many underserved youth who are in need of the services STOKE plans to provide, because they are either under achievers in School, are unmotivated and lack positive direction in learning important life skills or experience in all of these issues.
- To better meet this challenge, STOKE has developed this Directive.
- As a result of this process, STOKE now has:
 - A vision and mission for the organization
 - A growth plan centered on new youth programs
 - A streamlined set of metrics to track youth progress
 - A path forward to secure a continuous revenue stream
- STOKE's goal is to expand and, eventually, to help develop the model in other locations outside this Townsend/ Broadwater County locals.

Our successful programs are and have been:

- ◆ Sewing classes headed by our talented Laura Frazier. She has become a great mentor and instructor for several girls.
- ◆ Game night for adults and youth. We have two table tennis tables, a pool table, a foosball table, chess sets and other recreational equipment. We have a very nice projector and 8' screen for conducting a movie night. Because of Covid, our success of a movie night was limited but the potential is there for better showings in the future.
- ◆ We are still working on an Outdoor Program, which should be a very fun and educational program for our youth. Sign up has been slow but is still in the planning stage.
- ◆ Yoga and dance is also offered and has been very successful.

The instructor, Lenna Parr, is a very accomplished professional dancer (ballet) from New York.

- ◆ STOKE has partnered with AJAY (American Jobs for American Youth) and their Helena branch, HSJP (Helena Summer Jobs Program). We were able to place five kids with five employers here in Townsend and Helena. We did have some businesses that we were not able to place students with but hopefully we can next year. Thanks to Gabrielle Rowley, HSJP Program Director and Katria Shindoll for their hard work.
- ◆ STOKE has currently prioritized a community and youth project of assisting with the construction of a **Skatepark** for our local youth. We have acquired the blessing of the City Council to move forward but have yet to nail down the actual site for the Skatepark. Some potential areas have been identified with Holloway Park at the top of the list. Many interested youth along with STOKE will be fund raising for this project as the potential cost could be between \$150000 and \$250000 depending on the size and help from the community. We could possibly get started in 2022 with construction if all goes well. The kids are excited!
