

The next stop on the trip was the historic Methodist Church in Radersburg. The students learned about the role of famed Brother Van Orsdell in founding the church in Radersburg in 1917.

The favorite part of the students is always the trip to the Radersburg Cemetery. Jackie Smith from the Radersburg Cemetery Association was there and spoke to the students about the history of the cemetery and its residents. She was able to connect a number of the students to relatives buried in the cemetery. Of course, they were fascinated by the tales of shootings, murders and hangings.

Medicare Beneficiaries Beware: COVID-19 Test Kit Scam

Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) is a national program that engages agencies and volunteers in educating Medicare beneficiaries about how to prevent, detect, and report Medicare fraud, errors, and abuse. Rocky's Agency on Aging serves SMP in Lewis & Clark, Jefferson, and Broadwater counties. Medicare fraud, errors, and abuse cost an estimated 70 billion dollars a year in taxpayer money.

Recently, Montanans have reported that scammers billed Medicare for COVID-19 Tests Kits, at the cost of \$95 per kit. Medicare no longer covers home COVID-19 Test Kits and will not call you to provide them. This scam will likely soon. However, if the scammers have your Medicare number, they can use it in any fraudulent scheme.

How do you know if you've been a victim of fraud? If you have an Original Medicare plan, you should receive a Monthly Summary Notice (MSN) in the mail every month. If you have a Medicare Advantage plan, you should receive an Explanation of Benefits (EOB). If you see providers you did not go to or supplies you did not order (like the Test Kits) in your monthly statements, please call 1-800-551-3191 to report it. Also, if you have questions about mail, emails, or phone calls that you suspect might not be from Medicare, please contact us.

Rocky Aging is seeking volunteers in Broadwater, Jefferson, and Lewis & Clark counties to help spread the word about SMP by providing presentations or working with beneficiaries individually to address their questions about SMP. Sod Installed at Skate Park!

Since the skate park was installed about a year ago in Holloway Park, it has been a very popular place for kids and adults! Drive by almost any day and you will see skaters, bikers, scooters, etc. crafting their skills. The other thing you'd see as you drove by was the bare dirt surrounding the skate park - until last week. The sprinkler system was finished, and sod installed on all of the skate park. How wonderful the skate park looks because of the new sod and the new pavilion installed by the Amish working for the Broadwater County Parks and Recreation Board.

The sod was purchased from SodWorks at a discount by STOKE (Science, Technology, Outdoor Knowledge, and Entrepreneurship), the force behind getting the skatepark built. The first load of 2,000 square feet of sod was delivered, installed, and stapled on the steep slopes by a large group of people on June 21st on the southern end of the skate park. A week later,




6,000 square feet of sod arrived, and another large group of folks showed up and laid the sod around all but the last 2,000 square feet on the west end of the skate park! The rest of the sod was finished this past week. Wow! The groups worked hard and fast!

The evening after the 6,000 square

feet of sod was installed Jeff Ament (the Pearl Jam bassist who donated \$50,000 to help get the skatepark built) and his friends showed up and

skated on the park for awhile as well as some other adults from Texas and Georgia!

It takes a village! It was so nice to see so many people turn out to complete the work at the skatepark. Many organizations and volunteers helped lay sod including members from: STOKE, Rotary Club of Townsend and spouses, Missouri Valley Marketing, Broadwater County Parks and





Townsend Seeds, Broadwater County Park neighbors, and probably a few we forgot.

BCDC's Community Review Subcommittees Updates CARB (Community Advisory and Research Building) Committee - Community Buildings

This committee was formed to research the feasibility and possible options that are needed to design and hopefully construct a multi-function community building or buildings. We started meeting in April, so we are in the very early stages of this monumental project. There has been much support for a community building or facility in the Townsend area. In the previous meetings, we have been listing different design options which include an indoor swimming pool including therapeutic pools, a competition size pool; childcare facility; fitness and gym/s for wellness and competitions; meeting spaces; food vendors; commercial kitchen; auditorium; emergency services and shelter; others. These are all in various stages of research and need. One of the biggest concerns is location. Some of the concerns here are good access, room for expansion, parking, and proximity to town.

In all our research, we are committed to making these facilities as selfsupporting or self-sufficient as possible. We may find the funds to construct these facilities, but long-term maintenance will always be a major concern. We have not begun the search for funding yet but will start soon.

We have a decent roster of potential committee members but poor attendance. If anyone is interested in helping on this committee, please send a request to bcdc@mt.net with CARB in the subject line. John Hahn is the chairman for this committee.

Trails Committee

The Trails Committee has also been very active in pursuing several different pedestrian and bicycle routes with the end goal of producing a map of all these developed and potential trails for Broadwater County by the end of the year. Other projects within our scope are the building of a pedestrian bridge over the Missouri River north of Townsend and attached to the existing bridge. Another project is a paved trail from Harrison Street to the Fairgrounds. This trail has been identified in the Fairgrounds Master Plan and may well be one of our first accomplishments. The committee is anxiously awaiting a meeting with a few MDT officials to discuss the process to start these projects. Another priority is a permanent trail from the north Development Corporation, Holloway side of the river bridge to the Silos and beyond. Also, attaching a trail from Three Forks to the Copper City bike trails seems likely. Radersburg would like some dust-free paths for their residents north of town.

And pavers were installed around the There are many trails on government property such as US Forest Service, new pavilion! Thank you to all that BLM, and FWP but because of their lack of employees, we cannot list helped make the skate park a reality in individual trails but can mark areas that have trails within their boundaries. We are working on how to address these.

> The time is right for funding as there is much government money earmarked for the rural and urban trails nationally. We hope to tap into some of these funds as soon as we identify our priorities and have some shovel ready projects. HELENA AREA SUMMER JOBS PROGRAM KICKS OFF $$5^{\rm TH}$$ YEAR

American Jobs for America's Youth Montana (AJAY MT) held their Summer Jobs Program Kick-off on May 24 at Helena College, with over 50 student participants, mentors, and partners in attendance. The event celebrates the beginning of summer and offers an opportunity for students to meet their mentors over a meal.

Summer Jobs Program participants are motivated high school students and recent graduates who build work skills, explore careers, and strengthen the local workforce. The SJP has grown from its roots in Helena to serve 75 students this year, with new regional programs in Anaconda, Billings, Bozeman, Whitehall, and the Flathead Valley.



Isabella Williamson, age 18, of East Helena participated in the program the past two summers, working for the Helena Area Chamber of Commerce in 2021 and the Lewis and Clark County District Court in 2022. "The best thing to me about the Helena Area Summer Jobs Program is all the opportunities to learn they give you. Not only do they provide online courses to complete before you work, but you also get to attend various workshops and request a mentor who specializes in a subject that interests you," she says.

AJAY MT, a 501(c)3 nonprofit, created the Summer Jobs Program in 2019. By 2022 enrollment doubled, with the program expanding to six areas. "Our partners make it happen," says Executive Director Gabrielle Eklund Rowley, who actively engages students, volunteers, and agencies to grow the program. "It's a very collaborative effort."

The Summer Jobs Program matches high school students and recent grads with paid work experience, providing work skills training and connecting students with adult mentors. "The work skills training and opportunities to grow employability skills are unmatched. This program is essential in moving the dial in the workforce arena and shows a huge benefit to our community and area businesses," says McKinley Winkle, vice president of the Helena Area Chamber of Commerce.


Local partners include businesses; Helena, East Helena, and Broadwater high schools; Helena Area Chamber of Commerce; Helena College; Reach Higher Montana; and STOKE. Funding for the program comes from private foundations, community foundations, sponsors, and individual donors.

The program helps communities as well as the young employees, Eklund Rowley says. "The program is designed to sustainably improve the lives of young workers. The job skills students learn serve them well after the program ends, benefiting them as individuals and strengthening their communities."

Businesses also benefit. "Opportunity Bank of Montana sees tremendous value in the Summer Jobs Program and the additional workforce pipelines it creates," says Tom Burkhart, recruitment and retention officer. "We've matched with several fantastic students, one of whom has blossomed into a wonderful, long-term team member."

Eklund Rowley says it's gratifying to see the youth grow over the summer. "They learn so much about themselves. They really learn about what brings them satisfaction in a work setting. They learn to manage time, problem solve, talk with employers and coworkers, and build skills that will transfer across their careers." Williamson adds, "To future Helena Area Summer Jobs Program participants, just go for it! I know it can seem daunting, but it will be worth it."

Students started their SJP work positions in June. The Helena Area Summer Jobs Program celebration will be held August 8, 4-5pm at Helena College Airport Campus. Working Towards Community Childcare Solutions

Did you know that the labor force participation rate for Broadwater County is 47.7%? This is a figure that's established by the US Department of Labor Statistics. It is the percentage of the population that is either working or actively looking for work. By comparison, the state labor force participation rate is 62.3%. Why is our rate so much lower than the state rate? This is where it gets interesting and there are multiple factors that play into this figure. However, research shows that an influencer in work force participation is lack of affordable childcare.

A survey done by the Montana Department of Labor and Industry in 2020 found that about 6% of the state's labor force relies on childcare arrangements to remain in the labor force. However, that same survey also found that Montana's licensed childcare capacity only meets about 47% of the demand. In Broadwater County, this is even lower.

As of September 2022, there were six licensed childcare providers in Broadwater County which had the capacity for 66 children. There are an estimated 407 children under the age of 6 in the county, and about 156 children currently have working parents. It is probable that not all these children need childcare. However, last fall the childcare providers would have been able to provide care for less than half of that population. This also doesn't consider parents who are currently not working because of lack of childcare.

Now, the really bad news. Since September 2022, three licensed childcare providers have closed their doors in Broadwater County. Two closed from March to May of 2023. This just leaves three licensed providers in Townsend, and one of these providers is Headstart. Headstart is an early learning program targeted at low-income families that operates during the school year. It's a great program, but it's not a traditional daycare, so now we are down to two licensed childcare providers that provide daycare services. Total they have the capacity for about 20 children. And on top of that, there are no licensed providers that will take infants in Townsend.

So what does this mean for the Townsend community and local businesses? Hardly a day goes by where I don't hear about a local business looking for employees. Employee recruitment and retention is also a major issue in our community. Could this issue be directly linked to the lack of childcare? In my opinion, as well as the research and data shows that there is likely a strong connection. If parents do not have access to reliable and affordable childcare, then one parent will often opt to stay at home while their children are young.

So what can be done about this? Currently, there is a small group of interested community members who are looking at possible solutions. This group was formed from one of the priority areas identified in the Community Review that took place in 2022. They are looking at examples from other communities who successfully came together to manage the childcare gap. A good example is the city of Boulder which pooled resources from the school, city and a local nonprofit to develop a successful daycare. One of the major barriers for Townsend continues to be finding an adequate location for a childcare facility.

What can you do to help? Here is what the group needs from the community:

Group participants who are interested in exploring solutions or who may have ideas. The next meeting is Tuesday, July 11th at 10:00 am. Contact me for details.

Possible locations for a daycare. This could be an un- or underutilized business space, a home, church, etc.

Local entrepreneurs who are interested in starting their own childcare business. The reality is that we need multiple solutions to this problem. There are resources available for individuals to start their own business.

Businesses who are interested in being part of the solution who may

have space, resources, supplies, etc. for childcare providers.

As a working mother of three, I know firsthand the challenges of childcare in our community. However, I'm optimistic that our community can find a solution.
