2025 Broadwater High School Scholarship Recipients

The Broadwater Community Foundation (BCF) has a history of providing scholarships for Broadwater High School graduating seniors. In the application process, students explain how their involvement in community service activities and projects made them a well-rounded person and how they would encourage others to volunteer for community service. In 2025 the foundation granted \$11,500 in scholarships to nine graduating seniors. Amanda Pesicka's scholarship included additional funding from the Ray Doig scholarship funds which are managed by the foundation. IMPORTANT NOTICE to Parents & BHS Seniors

Every year, the Broadwater Community Foundation (BCF) offers scholarships on a competitive basis to Broadwater High School (BHS) graduating seniors interested in attending college. Students can receive between \$500 and \$3,500 to help with their educational expenses. The application process can easily be completed online beginning January 1, 2026.

To apply, visit the Montana Community Foundation (MCF) <u>Scholarship Portal</u> to create an account and log in. Once logged in, click the "Apply" button located at the top of your screen within the red banner. Here, you will be able to enter the access code for either BCF scholarship in the field labeled "Enter Access Code." The Broadwater Community Foundation Scholarship access code is 26BWCF. The Ray Doig Memorial Scholarship access code is 26DOIG.

Note that you may also complete the MCF Eligibility Quiz to be matched with other MCF scholarship opportunities. The Eligibility Quiz can be found on your dashboard screen when you first log into the Scholarship Portal.

In 2025, the Broadwater Community Foundation (BCF) granted \$12,000 to local non-profit organizations within the county plus \$11,500 in student scholarships, making the total grant/scholarship donations \$23,500. The grants helped local organizations with projects that benefit our community and its residents.

BCF awarded a \$3,000 grant to the Broadwater Food Pantry to help with repairs after a flood caused damage. Electrical and plumbing work, along with repairing the ceiling, walls and floors were all projects that the funds helped cover.

The STOKE (Science/Technology Outdoor Knowledge Entrepreneurs) Pottery Guild received a \$3,000 grant to go towards purchasing a pug mill for their pottery program. A pug mill allows for the program to reclaim and recycle discarded and used clay. The STOKE Pottery Guild continues to offer free pottery to students enrolled in STOKE

program and offers adults to utilize the space for a small cost. The STOKE program serves between 90-100 local students each year.

A \$3,000 grant was awarded to the Townsend School District for the Bulldogs Beyond Program. In the summer of 2026, the Bulldogs Beyond program will be taking 32 high school students to Paris, Lucerne, and Munich for an educational tour and cultural experience. These high school students and their families continue to fund-


raise in many different ways and BCF was happy to support these efforts with these awarded funds.

Broadwater Rural Fire District was awarded a \$3,000 grant for the purchase of smoke alarms and fire extinguishers that will be available for residents of Broadwater County at no cost. Volunteer firefighters will install these items in the homes when contacted by the homeowners. They will educate homeowners about family fire escape plans and demonstrate how to use the equipment. This opportunity will also give the recipients a chance to meet the firefighters in our community.

2025 Donations Reach \$15,119

The Broadwater Community Foundation (BCF) received \$15,119 in donations in 2025 and the board wanted to thank all the donors for their generous contributions this past year. These donations came through sponsorships, legacy giving, memorials, light of love gifts and other direct donations.

From the many generous donations throughout the years, and the interest earned on the endowment funds, the funds since 1995 have increased to over \$957,530. A percentage of the interest is used each year in local grants and student scholarships. The remaining interest is reinvested into the endowment so it will continue to grow, providing funds to serve our community for years to come.
